On 28th February the first report of a new coronavirus - or Covid-19 touching Irish shores was in relation to a woman who travelled through Dublin Airport on her way to Northern Ireland from Northern Italy. She subsequently tested positive for the illness on returning home to Belfast.

On 1st March a secondary school closed in the East of the Country for 14 days as it was confirmed that a male student had the virus. He had returned from a ski-ing trip.

On 2nd March the majority of Google's 8,000 staff and contractors in Ireland were told to go home after one member reported flu-like symptoms.

Various people developed the virus between then and

Thursday 12th March The Taoiseach Leo Varadkar announces that schools, colleges and childcare facilities will close until 29 March. Online learning began for those who had Google Classroom or Seesaw and work was issued to children via the internet. Eventually all Junior Cert & Leaving Cert exams cancelled and an announcement made that Schools would not return until September or October.

Friday 12th March most businesses made urgent arrangements for the majority of employees to work from home from Monday 16th March.

15th March. All pubs, including hotel bars were asked to close until at least 29th March in a bid to curb the spread of Covid-19.

On 28th March lockdown began in Ireland with a mandatory order for everyone to stay at home for a two week period apart from certain exemptions and essential workers throughout the whole Country. You can only leave your house for medicine, shopping (food) or vital reasons (ie medical appointments). Only those considered essential workers must go to work. This has been extended and is still ongoing today. It is not being reviewed until Monday 18th May 2020.

Community support groups were established, to support the vulnerable, elderly, immunocompromised and people in enforced isolation due to exposure, in their community who were asked to co-coon and stay indoors at all times ...

Some played music,, some sang songs and some played Bingo! Some delivered food packages, did food shopping and did whatever they felt necessary to help their neighbours.

From Thursday 26th March at 8pm and every Thursday night thereafter, we all stood united on our doorsteps, balconies and open windows and applauded and cheered for all our amazingly brave NHM/HSE staff 👋 🔤 🍑 🔤 who so courageously and selflessly battled on to try and save as many lives as possible • We lit candles in memory of those who died from the virus 🕯

Weddings family celebrations holiday gatherings even funerals cancelled In Ireland a maximum of 10 people from the deceased's immediate family are permitted to attend funerals while maintaining social distancing of 2 metres.


Households that can't see their friends and loved ones come together across the country by using Zoom or Houseparty to play games or host pub quiz nights.
